## **Developing a Personal Mission Statement**

Laurie Beth Jones, in her book, <u>The Path</u>, states that "having a clearly articulated mission statement gives one a template of purpose that can be used to initiate, evaluate, and refine all of one's activities."

### **Definitions:**

"Mission" is defined as a specific <u>task</u> that a person or group is sent to perform. Having a personal mission statement helps you to focus on what God has called you to be and do.

"Vision" can be defined as looking into the future and visualizing the <u>results</u> that you anticipate happening as a result of your mission and the plan of action that is implemented. Developing a personal mission statement is the first step in identifying/clarifying what God has called you to do. This becomes the basis for formulating your ministry plan.

Romans 1:5, expresses in a few words the personal mission statement of the Apostle Paul. "*Through him and for his name's sake, we received grace and apostleship to call people from among all the Gentiles to the obedience that comes from faith.*"

There are several simple steps that you need to take to develop your mission statement.

- To <u>inspire</u> others to commit themselves to reaching the youth of the world by giving adequate resources.
- To <u>motivate</u>, train, and assist qualified men and women who will go to the ends of the earth to reach young people who have never heard the Gospel.
